In a country of division and strife, the churches of South and North Korea meet together regularly each year to pray and plan joint mission priorities. This in itself is remarkable, but the growing confidence and strength in their shared faith and vigilant attention to human rights is gaining influence on governmental practices and humanitarian treatment.

Last year the National Council of Churches in Korea (NCKK) and the Korea Christian Federation (KCF) in the North agreed to use a common prayer in all of the churches of South and North Korea on Easter Sunday. They ask all of us to join in their prayer journey for healing and reconciliation. The prayer reads in part:

O God, Lord of our history as well as of our nation!

Today we praise you, Lord, who have risen as Eternal Life through the struggle for righteousness, between lies and truth, at the fork of the path of dying or living....

O Lord, who is still alive and is with us!

As the one day of resurrection has brought a new day continuing through all eternity, and as you accomplish the salvation of all humankind and all creation through the risen One, Free us from the reality of war and conflict and from the world of antagonism and jealousy through your mercy and grace.

O Lord! Help us, churches of North and South, sisters and brothers of North and South, to achieve resurrection itself with one accord. Help us to enjoy a life of peace through our belief and action. Help us to be reborn as one nation wearing white clothes, a new nation of white and cleanness. Help us to build a kingdom of peace serving our neighbors, to open a new day of reunification standing firmly as light for the world.

**He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, knelt down and prayed. Luke 22:41**

Holy Week begins on Sunday, April 5<sup>th</sup>, with our celebration on Palm Sunday. During the week there are numerous possibilities for participating in special activities including Greeley Interfaith Association Holy Week services, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services here at First Christian, a Good Friday Prayer Vigil, and Easter morning festivities beginning at 6:30 a.m. Printed just below this article is a schedule of the various activities.

I don't know about you, but I'm exhausted from just writing that sentence about the activities. On one hand, Holy Week is the most important week in the Christian calendar, so it makes sense that we have a lot happening. In an ideal world, my advice would be to put everything else in your life on hold for that week in order to experience more fully its meaning.

On the other hand, I am well aware that we do not live in an ideal world. Obligations such as work, cooking, dishes, family commitments, and taxes don't stop because we are in Holy Week. Neither our kids nor our dog would appreciate it much if Jodi and I decided that dinner isn't necessary during Holy Week.

Here is my proposal. Look now at what you have planned during Holy Week. Is there anything on that schedule you might move so that you can participate more fully in Holy Week? If there is, move it. Dedicate time for prayer. Dedicate time for worship. If you can't make any changes, don't exhaust yourself by trying to do everything. Choose carefully and wisely so that your spirit may be filled, not exhausted.

If your schedule is that full, however, you also need to start taking a look at Holy Week next year (and every week for that matter). Is your schedule so full that you cannot dedicate time to prayer and spiritual growth? If it is, it's time to think about priorities and simplifying. It's time to think about making an appointment with God every day.

May you feel God's blessings in this time of year and always.

## GUTENBERG BIBLE

Johannes Gutenberg, who is credited as being the inventor of printing from movable type, was born between 1394 and 1400, and died in 1468. He printed the Bible sometime between 1450 and 1455, the exact date being unknown, but copies were for sale before August 1456. There were 42 lines per column. Forty-seven copies survive, of which 13 are in the United States. (Source: Encyclopedia Americana.) Western history ignores that the Chinese had been printing long before the Gutenberg press was invented. (Source: 1421—The Year China Discovered America, p. 62.)

In 1782, the first Bible was published in the United States. George Hypes has a very fragile old Bible that was published in the United States in 1805.

## CWS TRAVELS TO INDONESIA

Over 225,000 people were killed when the tsunami struck Indonesia and surrounding areas on December 26, 2004. Nine volunteers from the Church World Service (CWS) **Rocky Mountain Region** just returned from visiting the site, the mass graves, and families whose lives are being rebuilt from one of the deadliest natural disasters in recorded history.

## ELDERS' MESSAGE

As a new Elder, I have so many thoughts on what to write to you about. Is it the life of our church, what the Elders are doing, or our upcoming Holy Week activities? The list can go on and on, but I've been reading Unbinding the Heart by Martha Grace Reese, and I've been learning to begin to allow the Spirit to connect me with God. The word that I keep coming up with for this WNF journey, is WOW!

I've been getting these nudges that I'm not used to. I'm beginning to realize they are from the Holy Spirit, directing me to think and act in ways that aren't in my natural tendencies. You see, I haven't been the greatest example for prayer, and I don't think I have the deepest understanding of the power of prayer, but the picture is starting to come into focus. By nature I am a doer, a decision maker, and I generally don't have a great deal of patience.

I believe that God is sending messages to me and to our church through this book study. God is sending us a reminder to let the reins go – to turn it over! This might be a bit scary and unnatural—it is for me! Yes, we are the ones who will take action when needed; however, we don't always need to make the decisions. We often get stuck in the habit of over-thinking solutions (personal, professional, and church related) based on what we think the outcome will be. We base decisions on the reactions we will get (positive and negative) from those we care about. I'm going to go out on a limb here— maybe we need to start taking the human tendencies out of our decision making. We might find that individual and group prayer will provide us with the best solutions and results. We need to be mindful that our prayers might need to change:

- ~How and where will we pray? Who or what will we pray for?
- ~What will we need in order to focus and connect with God?
- ~Will we remember to let go and allow God to show us the way?
- ~Are we open to God's will?
- ~Will we be patient, and will we look for the small or hidden answers or changes?

As one of your Elders, I will do my best to take off the bridle and allow God to show me the way. Will you?

Heavenly Father, we praise you in all that we do! Bring the Holy Spirit to enter our hearts and minds to provide us with the ultimate connection - the line to you, God. Help us to let go and to release our burdens, concerns, and decisions to you. Father, guide us in all that we do and say. Give us strength, courage, and love to share the faith we have in You. Forgive us for our transgressions and help us to be forgiving of others. It is in Jesus name we pray. Amen.
