

### Does Anybody Really Know What Time It Is?

*“Who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?”*

Esther 4:14b

Everyone jokes about African time, but I think the North American concept of time is a big joke. Have you ever noticed how often you hear the word ‘busy’ in a day? Being busy in North American culture is highly valued. By contrast, African culture does not value being busy. If you ask someone if they are busy, they look at you strangely. Don’t even try to ask someone what time it is. They don’t have watches. This culture values spending time with friends and family, and helping each other.

In North American culture, I may have had six or seven meetings a day. A typical day in Africa consists of ‘footing’ to my office and waiting until someone walks in and wants to talk to me. Sometimes there is a meeting scheduled, although it’s rare to have an appointment. No one has a watch, let alone a phone to call ahead. A meeting scheduled for nine generally starts at 9:30, but sometimes it gets underway at ten or even eleven. This culture values discussion and consensus building. Decision-making by consensus takes time, so there is no predicting when a meeting will end. The more people that attend, the longer the meeting.

Waiting, such as waiting in line or a “queue,” is something we in North America abhor. But it is expected in Africa. Why hurry? We in North America never loiter, dawdle or linger around. We are busy. In my former life I was so busy I had to schedule a phone call with my friends. There were never enough hours in a day. When my children were young, I often missed their sporting events or dance recitals because I was busy. But here, loitering is a way to chat and connect with friends and family. (And everyone is family.) In Africa, I loiter. I meet a lot of people that way. I learn about their lives, their families, and their values. Maybe we in North America have it all wrong. Maybe the joke is on us. Maybe we should loiter more often.

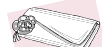

## A Moment With Tim

**In the seventh year there shall be a sabbath of complete rest for the land, a sabbath for the LORD: you shall not sow your field or prune your vineyard.** Leviticus 25: 4

Toward the end of last year, the newsletter contained several articles about sabbatical leave. The timeframe for my sabbatical has now been set. The sabbatical will begin June 13 and end on September 13. A sabbatical team has been formed, and there is a note in this newsletter about the work of that group.

Sabbatical is a time for spiritual renewal and growth. You have been able to read about the importance of sabbatical in the newsletter articles, but I have not shared what my sabbatical will entail. Below is a summary of my sabbatical proposal. I included this summary in a grant application.

The title for the sabbatical, "Sharing Hope and Life in Community" comes from the mission statement of our congregation. One of my greatest impulses for going into full-time ministry was to follow Jesus' model of serving those around him, especially "the least of these." I am excited about some of the ways our congregation is reaching into the community with love, service, and hope. I am also aware of some wonderful new (and not so new) models of ministry.

Because I serve as a senior minister, my time is divided in many areas. Worship planning, visitation, administration, as well as family life take up much of my time. It is challenging to find enough time for a vital prayer life and to keep up with current books.

My sabbatical proposal is structured around reading about innovative models of ministry, visiting places where that ministry takes place, and renewing my love affair with God and serving God's people. In the process I hope to return to the parish with fresh ideas, the energy to pursue them, and a renewed sense of balance in aspects of ministry and life."

If you have questions, ideas, or concerns I welcome you to share them with me. I would be glad to share with you more detailed plans of my sabbatical. It is my prayer and belief that the sabbatical experience will be rewarding to the congregation and to me.

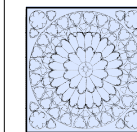
### "FCC Crafting Crowd"

## Pastor Linda's Ponderings

**“But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day.” 2 Peter 3:8**

There is a saying—I am sure you have all heard it: “Time flies when you are having fun!” I would say that is also true of serving God. This month will mark my one-year anniversary here at First Christian Church! I am grateful for this past year, for the ways that God has moved in my life and in the life of this congregation. I will admit that it wasn't easy to leave my last church, a place where I felt secure, a place where my family found comfort.

I am finishing up leading a Bible/Video series on “Why God Doesn't Give Us Everything We Want.” As we explored this question together, I discovered that one big reason God does not give us what we want is because we don't really know what we want. Sometimes what we think would be the best for us really isn't the best thing for us at all. We learned right away that God sometimes moves us from our comfort zones, our places of security, in order to change us, in order for us to grow into the person God created us to become. Leaving my previous church was one of those times. But even in the midst of leaving and the sense of loss that I felt, I soon realized that this change was a blessing. See—if I had not left, then I would have missed the opportunity to be here! I feel very blessed to know that God loved me enough not to leave me where I was—instead he brought me to a place where I could have new experiences and opportunities to grow, a place where I could share in ministry together with others. What God did was broaden my understanding of church and the world; he connected me with this church family here and with the people of Greeley.

I give thanks for this church family, for your love, support, and encouragement for me as well as for one another. I am looking forward to this next year. I can't wait to see how God will continue to move in our lives, to see the opportunities God will bring for ministry and service, and to see the ways that we will grow and become closer to God and one another!

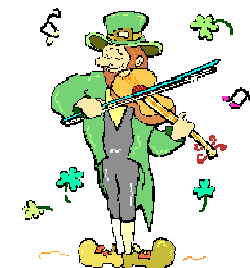
