

"Selfless Selfies"

Have you ever taken a selfie? A popular trend today is to take a selfie and post it on a social media network such as Twitter or Facebook. We see these photos even shared on television.

For those who are not "in the know," a selfie is a self-portrait photograph we take with a digital camera or camera phone. They usually take a selfie with the camera or camera phone held at arm's length or in a mirror. If we take one with others they call it a "group selfie."

At first I thought I had never done a selfie, but then realized that selfies are nothing new. Many people took pictures of themselves by holding a camera at arm's length and snapping the shot. Yet in the past we couldn't see what we are taking, and haven't always been able to see what we just took without getting the picture developed.

I think selfies can have an important role in our world. The Today show once explored our obsession with body image and how we can join together to feel more positive about ourselves. They launched a series called "Love Your Selfie" to help us improve our self-image. Selfies can help us celebrate who we are and how precious we all are to God inside and out, and not just focus on outward images sustained by our culture.

That said, I think we can sometimes become too obsessed with our self and our self-image. We compare ourselves with others, and either feel better than or less than they are. I suggest we turn our attention outward to caring for others, for then we help them and we in turn nurture our own self-image.

Jesus taught us to "love our selfie" but also to love one another just as much. I would like us to start taking selfies while serving others, then post those on our social media sites. We can start a new trend of "selfless selfies" and put #selflessselfies in the tweet or post so that we all can see it.

I will see you in church. Remember, God loves you more than you could ever imagine and so do!!
