Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not rely on your own insight.

In all thy ways acknowledge God and God will direct your path.

Proverbs 3:5-6

Seems simple. So, why is trusting God so difficult? Maybe we have the wrong definition of trust. Like most of us, I worry about what the future will bring. I often think that if I could just know that everything will be okay, then I could relax and let things unfold. The problem is that often what is "okay" for me means life will turn out the way I would like it to. But when will I know if things "turn out?" Life is a journey; (cliché, I know) but maybe there is no destination. We could say heaven, but are we really living this life just to get to heaven?
