Elder's Message

In honor of Memorial Day, and in appreciation to all those who are serving and have served in our country's military, we reprint this 2019 column by former elder Diane Doyle.

"In Flanders Fields"

By Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, MD (1872-1918) Canadian Army

In Flanders Fields the poppies blow Between the crosses row on row, That mark our place; and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders Fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe: To you from failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold it high. If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders Fields.

"In Flanders Fields" memorializes the terrible battle in Flanders (now Belgium) in the spring of 1915 (WW I). Although McCrae had been a doctor for years and had served in the South African War, he found the suffering in this battle to be unprecedented. As a surgeon attached to the 1st Field Artillery Brigade, Major McCrae spent 17 days treating injured men—Canadian, British, Indian, French, and German. He later described the ordeal as "seventeen days of Hades." One of the casualties was his former student, and McCrae performed his funeral ceremony.

The next day as he sat on the back of a parked ambulance overlooking the nearby cemetery, he could see the wild poppies that grew in the ditches. He spent 20 minutes scribbling this poem. He handed his writing pad to a soldier, who described the poem as "an exact description of the scene in front of us both." The doctor tossed the poem away, but a fellow officer retrieved it, and it was published on December 8, 1915.
