Chances are you know the story of the poor widow and her two mites (coins similar to a penny) found in both Mark 12 and Luke 21. Jesus was by the Temple near the collection box. Those who were rich put in large amounts, but this poor widow who had only a few mites added them to the box. Jesus told His disciples was that the widow had put in more than the others. The rich had offered their excess - the widow gave all she had. I have always struggled with this story. In my profession, I caution clients to be sure they use their limited funds to secure the roofs over their heads and keep something for an emergency fund. I know it's difficult to understand that God will provide if I give everything I own. I'll keep working on that fear.

However, I feel certain that what we have, be it a little or a lot, comes from a plan God designed. As we approach our 2024 pledging, let's give some of our assets, talents, and time. These are essential to a healthy ministry, building, outreach, and programs. This giving is how we can honor God and receive the joy of being a part of this church community.
